**Glacial Trail Scenic Byway Stakeholder meeting to be held at
The Prairie Heritage Center**

The Glacial Trail Scenic Byway Steering Committee invite all who are interested to the Annual Stakeholder Meeting, which will be held September 23, 2010 at 5:30 p.m. at the Prairie Heritage Center.

The meeting agenda will include: an update of the past year's accomplishments as well as forming additional committees. Everyone is invited--even if you are just curious and want to know more about the project. The byway project is a great opportunity to highlight the area with all its beautiful scenery and history as well its recreational opportunities.

The Glacial Trail Scenic Byway is a 36 mile loop that takes in the four corners of Clay, Buena Vista, Cherokee and O'Brien Counties. It is located in the Little Sioux River Valley which includes some of the most scenic areas in Iowa.

The Glacial Trail Scenic Byway is one of nine state-designated and two nationally designated scenic byways across Iowa that have received new life thanks to a partnership with the Iowa Department of Transportation (DOT) and the Resource Conservation & Development (RC&D) organizations across the state. In northwest Iowa the Iowa Lakes RC&D is working with a local steering committee to make our byway more visible and inviting for visitors locally and from afar.

Directions to Prairie Heritage Center: three miles west of Peterson or four miles east of Sutherland on HWY 10 and one half mile north on Yellow Avenue. Follow the Conservation Board sign.
